NSI Conducts Workshop for Senior Executives of Vietnam Postal Savings, at Hanoi (Vietnam)

National Savings Institute, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India, for the first time, had conducted the Workshop on 'Marketing and Savings Mobilisation' during 24-26 April, 2006 at Hanoi Vietnam. The objective of the Workshop was to enable the Senior Managers from Vietnam Postal Savings Service Company to understand the various Marketing Techniques used by National Savings Institute in the field of Mobilisation of Resources.

The Workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Hoang Tho Thai, Vice President of Vietnam Post & Telecommunication Corporation, and also attended by Mr. Nguyen Van Gam, Director, VPSC. Shri Tuhin Kukar, I.F.S., Counsellor of the Indian Embassy based at Hanoi and Ms. Emma Fernandes, Dy.
