## NSI organizes Annual Review Meeting of Regional Directors at Panaji (Goa)

National Savings Institute (NSI), Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India organized a National-level conference of Regional Directors at Panaji, Goa on April 09, 2012. The conference was inaugurated by Shri Shaktikanta Das, I.A.S. and Additional Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Finance and chaired by Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director and Head of Department of NSI. Shri Ritvik Pandey, Deputy Secretary, Ministry of Finance also graced the occasion. Besides reviewing the achievements of the NSI during the year 2011-12 and drawing action plan for the current financial year, the objective of the conference was to devise overall strategies for mobilization of collections under small savings.

In his inaugural address, Shri Shaktikanta Das said that, in view of the emerging economic scenario of the country, small savings schemes are likely to emerge as one of the most attractive investment options for the Indian middle class investors, and therefore, emphasized the need to effectively communicate the benefits of small savings schemes to the masses in a cost effective manner. He explained that, Scheme like 10 year National Savings Certificate purchased today guarantees a annual return of 8.9% for the coming 10 years irrespective of the interest rates prevailing at that time. He stressed upon the officers of NSI to work in close co-ordination with State Govts., self-help groups and local self-government institutions to reach out to general public.

### **NSI organizes Annual Review Meeting of Regional Directors at Panaji (Goa)**

Shri Anil Bhattacharya during his welcome address highlighted the achievements of NSI during 2011-12. He informed that NSI plans to utilize print and electronic media, in a big way, besides the conventional means, to extensively publicize small savings schemes among the masses, especially the economically disadvantaged sections of society.
