

## NSI CELEBRATES SANCHAYIKA DAY THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY

Sanchayika Day is celebrated every year on 15th September by NSI. This year also the Sanchayika Day was celebrated by NSI at the Head Quarter of Regional Directors across the country on 15th September 2010. The objective of celebration of Sanchayika Day was to promote the habit of thrift among the students in schools/colleges, to apprise them with the knowledge of banking & accounting system and to promote leadership as they are furture citizens.

Sanchayika is a school savings bank run by the students for the students. The collections made by the students under Sanchayika scheme is deposited in the Post Office Savings Account operated by a Board of Trustees consisting of Principal/Head Master and two student representatives of the school/college. The savings collected on fixed days from students is entered into the pass-books and the pass books are handed over to the students. The various competitions viz. eassy, elocution, quiz etc. were organized for students and NSI awarded the prizes to the winners of the competitions on the occasion. The distinguished guests at the function appreciated the role played by NSI in promoting financial literacy among the students.
