## NSI organizes a quarterly review meeting and core group meeting of regional director at Nsi (HQ)

National Savings Institute, which is operating as Inspection Wing of Ministry of Finance to ensure Anti Money Laundering and Combating Financing of Terrorism through postal network conducted a quarterly review meeting on 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2012 and reviewed the activities undertaken by various regional centers. It was found that so far 468 inspections have been carried out at various post offices all over the country and almost all the post offices found partially compliant of KYC norms laid down by Govt. of India. Needless to mention that about 1200 inspections per annum are proposed to be carried out as per the target of Ministry of Finance for National Savings Institute.

In addition to inspection work other activities like investors awareness campaigns, rural savings campaigns inclusive growth by increasing number of accounts and imparting training to postal network, agents and bankers are being undertaken by National Savings Institute. On 24<sup>th</sup> August 2012 a Core Group Meeting of Regional Directors were conducted under the Chairmanship of Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director, NSI to devise future strategy for coping up with the challenges for enlarging the market share and observance of government guidelines in the mobilization of savings. It was observed that proportionate gross collection target is being achieved against the fixed target of Rs. 2,16,000 Crores and all out efforts will be made to achieve the gigantic target for the year 2012-13 with the active participation of team NSI all over the country.

The savings collected on fixed days from students is entered into the pass books and the pass books are handed over to the students. The various competitions viz. essay, elocution, quiz etc. were organized for students and NSI awarded the prizes to the winners of the competitions on the occasion. The distinguished guests at the function appreciated the role played by NSI in promoting financial literacy among the students. The Sanchayika Day celebration by the Regional Centers was covered by the print and electronic media. A special Ad on the Sanchayika Day was released by NSI through DAVP.
