National Savings Institute, Ministry of Finance participates in 13th WSBI Postal Savings Banks forum and WSBI-BMGF Doubling savings account project-mid-term Workshop held on 18-22 October 2010 at Cape Town, South Africa.

Director National Savings Institute (NSI), Nagpur Shri Anil Bhattacharya and Shri M. A. Khan, Under Secretary, Ministry of Finance was nominated by the Government to attend the 13th WSBI Postal Savings Bank Forum and Mid Term Workshop at Cape Town in South Africa. The workshop was organized by World Savings Banks Institute and Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. The theme of the 13th Postal Savings Bank Forum was 'Meeting the Competitiveness and inclusion of Challenges through improved Postal Banking Services'. During the two day deliberations, the focus was on how the Postal offices have been involved in the provision of banking services to the mass markets for a long time and their proximity network for a competitive retail banking and expansion of financial services to unbanked.

The 13th Postal Savings Banks Forum reviewed a number of the adoptions, which postal savings institutions need to go through with a view to meet the objectives of offering a competitive range of retail products and services and to play a prominent social and financial inclusion role. The workshop was attended by 100 delegates from member countries including India El Salvador, Iran, Pakistan, Tajikistan, La Poste, Indonesia, Vietnam, Zimbabwe, Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, South Africa, Morocco, Bolivia, Sri Lanka and other nations.

During the workshop, various modalities on doubling of savings accounts for the poor for improving the outreach of the products and services offered by NSI to the poorest of the poor.

NSI Director, Shri. Anil Bhattacharya, had given a presentation where he mentioned that African Country can take the advantage of the expertise, developed by NSI in the field of mobilization of resources.

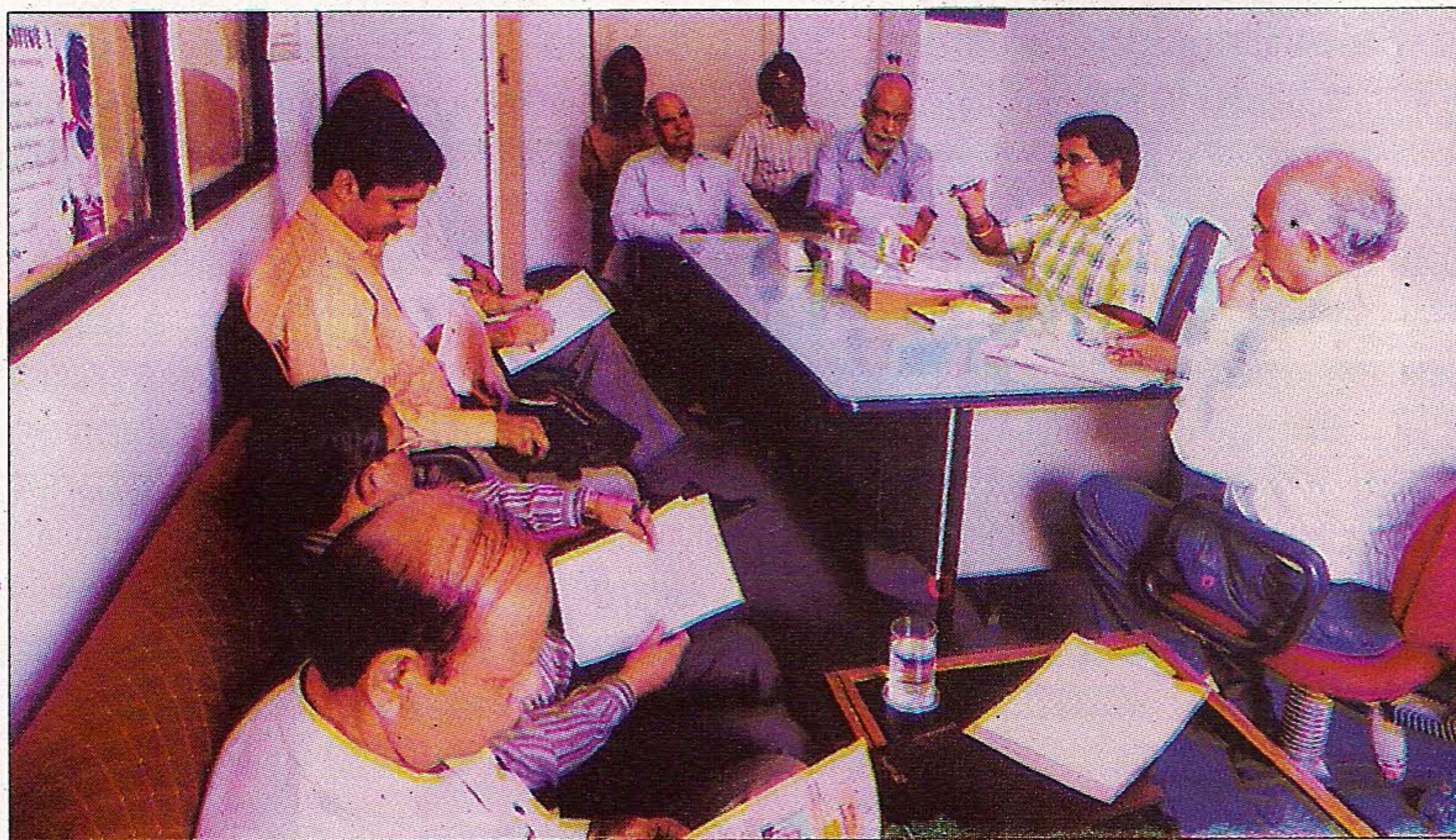

NSI Organized workshop on “Strategies For Mobilization of Resources Through Effective Administration” for Regional Director
