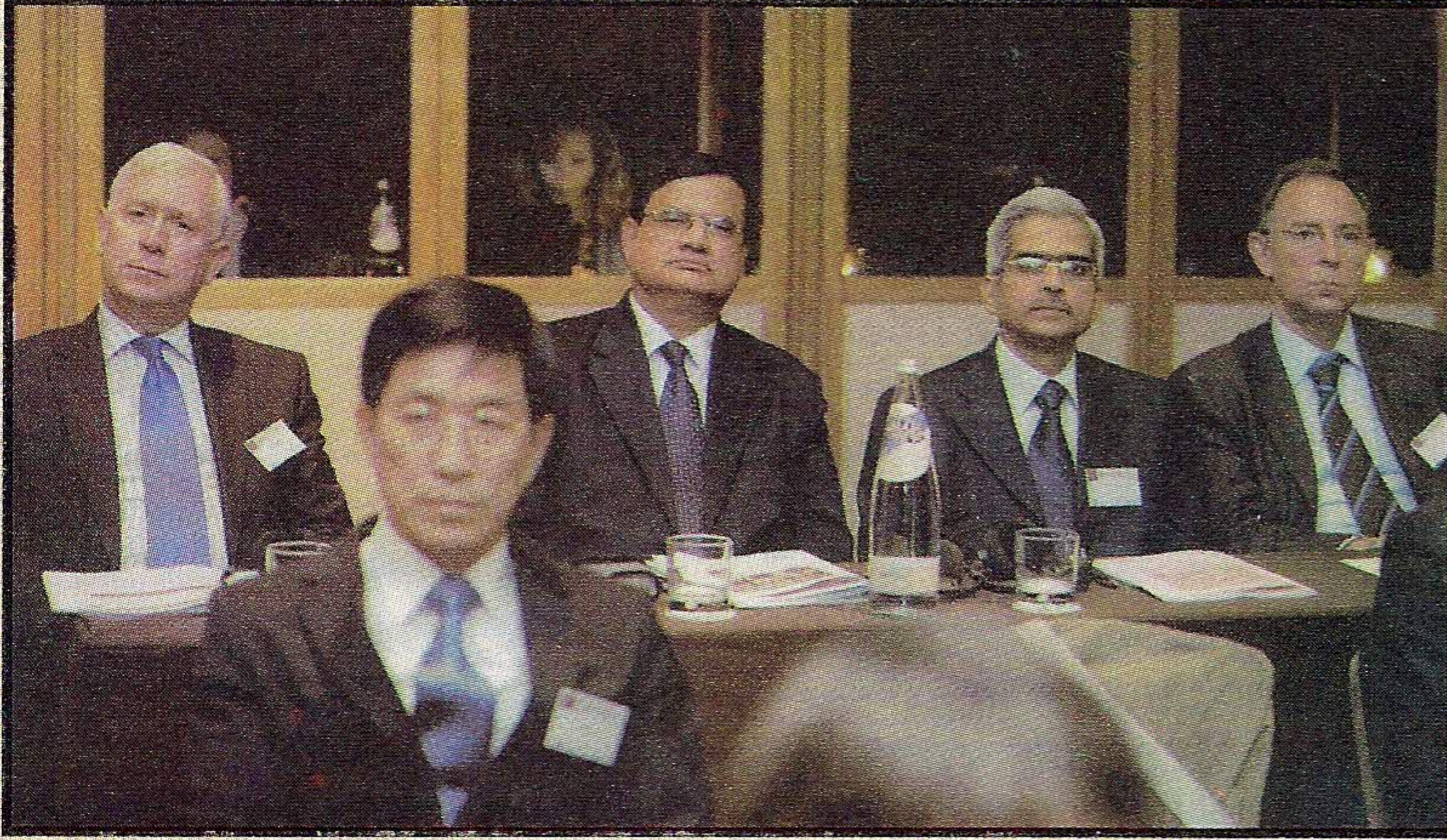

Shri S. K. Das, I.A.S., Joint Secretary, Govt. of India, Ministry of Finance and Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director & Head, NSI were nominated by the Ministry of Finance to attend 17th WSBI General Assembly and 9th WSBI Board of Directors meeting at Edinburgh, Scotland during 9-11 June 2010. The meeting was organized by the World Savings Banks Institute-European Savings Bank Group in collaboration with Lloyds Banking Group, Scotland. The theme of the event was 'A strong and a lasting business model for responsible, original retail banking'. The event was inaugurated by Lady Susane Rice, President, Banking of Scotland.

During the conference, various topics were discussed *i.e.* saving & retail banking and responsible way of banking, banking model present all over the world, role of savings bank in redistribution of assets and empowerment etc. The eminent speakers from Edinburgh University, World Bank, IMF and European countries addressed the delegates. During the meeting Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director & Head, NSI mentioned that NSI is going to impart training to 10 African Countries namely Tanzania, Uganda, Kenya, South Africa etc. during the year 2010-11 under India Africa Forum Summit and also informed about the participation of NSI in Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation programme for increasing access to finance. Director, NSI discusses about the financial literacy programme with Dy. Governor, RBI

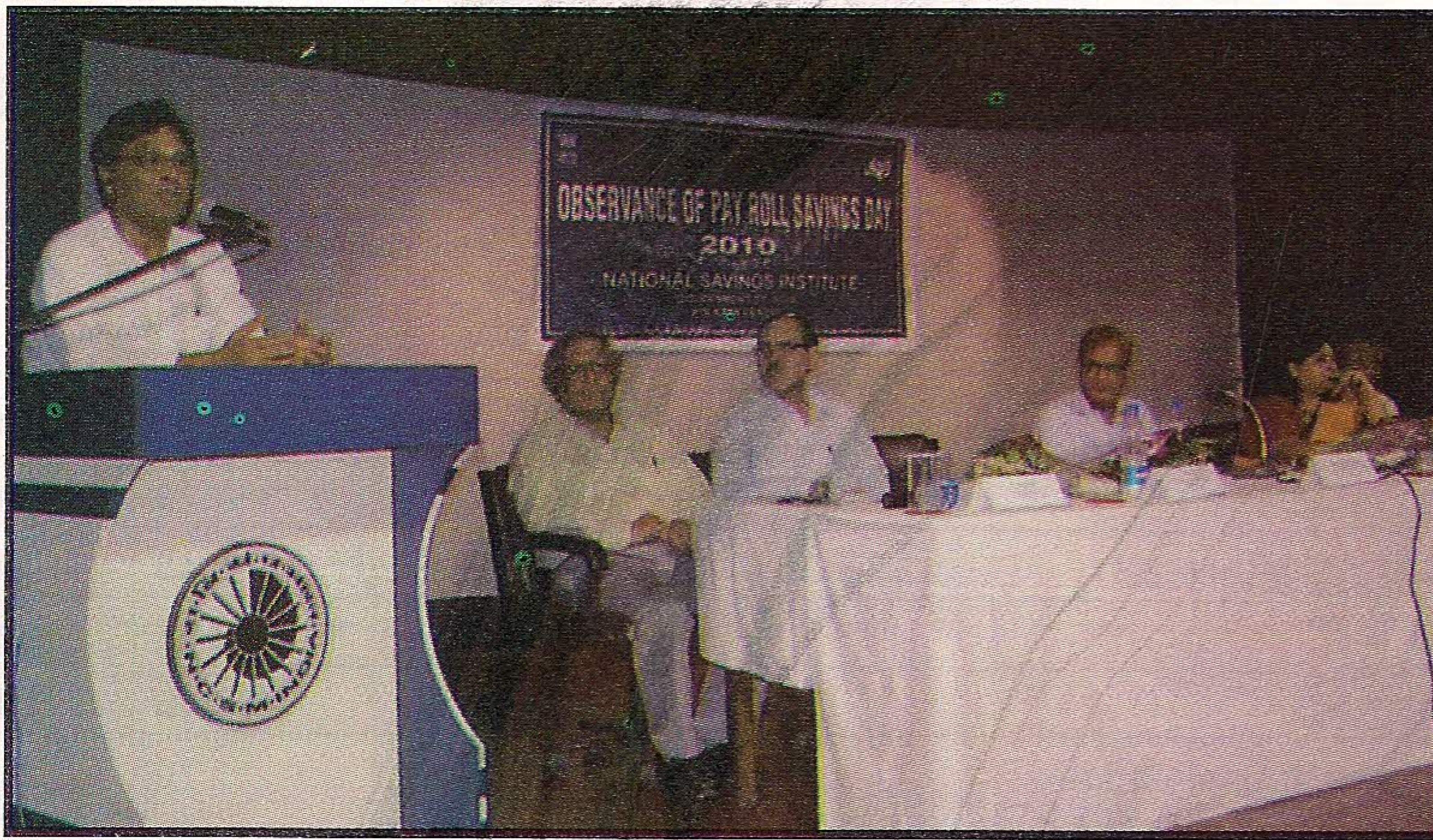

It has been an endeavour of NSI to provide National Savings Products to meet the needs of various segments of the investor. Pay Roll Savings Scheme is an exclusive scheme to meet the requirement of the salaried class who want to have a regular saving every month. In this system, the employee gives an authorization to the employer to deduct a fixed amount from the salary for opening a Recurring Deposit Account, Public Provident Fund Account or to purchase NSC VIII issue from designated Post Office. This system is automatic and the employee need not go to the Post Office for depositing the amount.

Every year NSI celebrates Pay Roll Savings Day on 15th July to highlight the importance of Pay Roll Savings Scheme and give more thrust to the personal savings. This year also, the Pay Roll Savings Day was celebrated throughout the country at Regional Centers of NSI on 15th July, 2010.
