Hon'ble Former Lok Sabha Speaker, Appreciates Role of NSI in Mobilisation of Resources

Shri R.N. Mukherjee, Regional Director, NSI, Guwahati Center called upon Shri Somnath Chatterjee, Hon'ble Former Lok Sabha speaker at Guwahati on 11th May 2009 and apprised him about the small savings activities carried out by NSI Guwahati Center in Assam & North Eastern States.

During his meeting with the Hon'ble Former Lok Sabha Speaker, the Regional Director apprised that NSI Guwahati Center which comprises of States viz. Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Mizoram, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Tripura & Sikkim collected Rs. 2050 crores gross during the year 2008-09 which is an increase of 35.38% over the gross collections during the year 2007-08. He informed him about organizing Rural Savings campaigns with the help of Self Help Groups with an objective to increase the financial literacy among the rural masses which helped NSI to open about 1.70 lac new accounts. He also briefed him about the training programmes organised for small savings agents who act as a catalyst between the National Savings Products and the investors for mobilisation of resources.

Shri Somnath Chatterjee, Hon'ble Former Lok Sabha Speaker appreciated the role of NSI in mobilisation of resources and increasing the financial literacy among the people in Assam & North Eastern States.

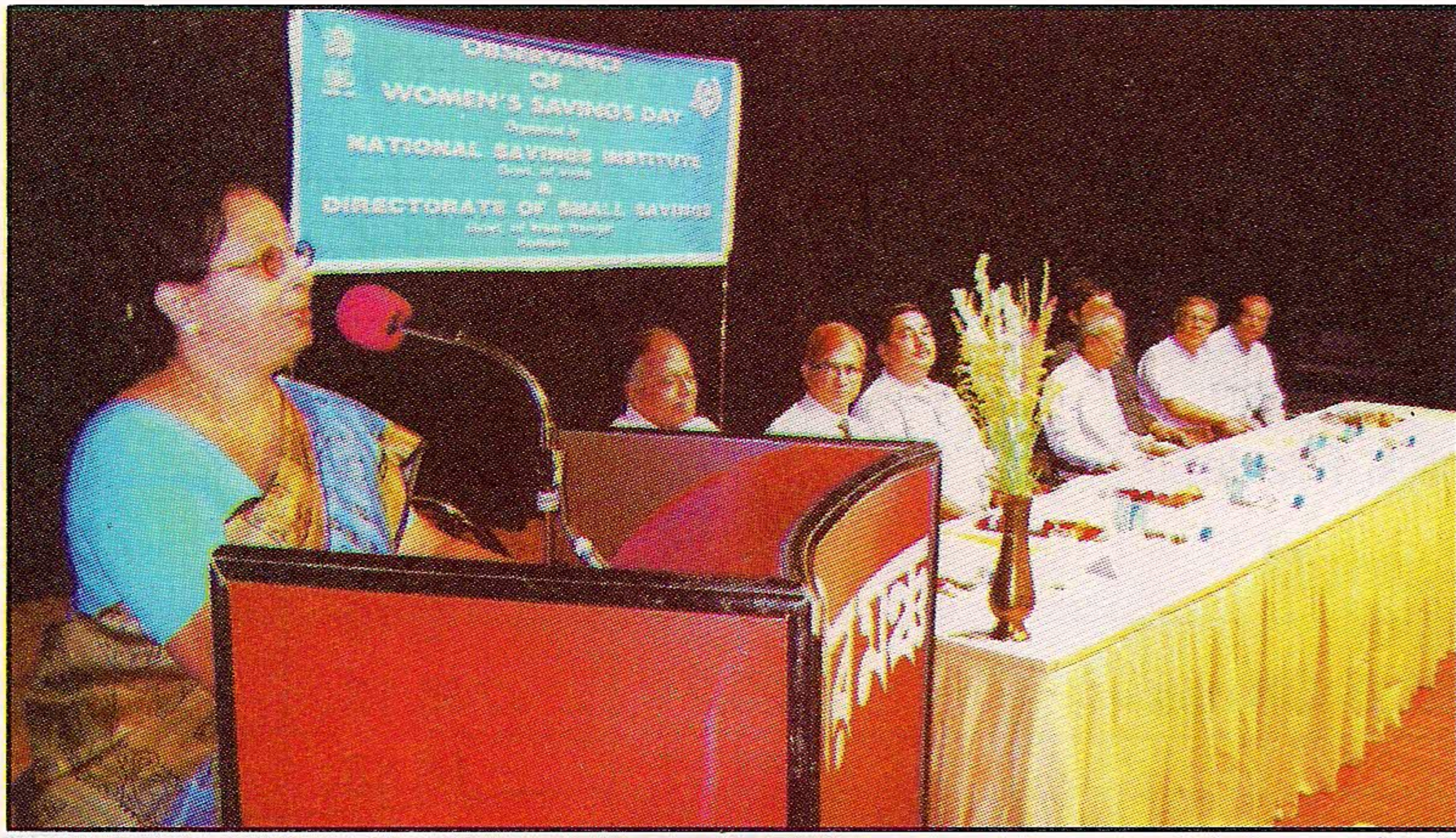
NSI Regional Centre Bangalore Conducts Workshop For Postal Inspectors
