## NSI Participates in General Assembly and Board of Directors of WSBI at Bali, Indonesia

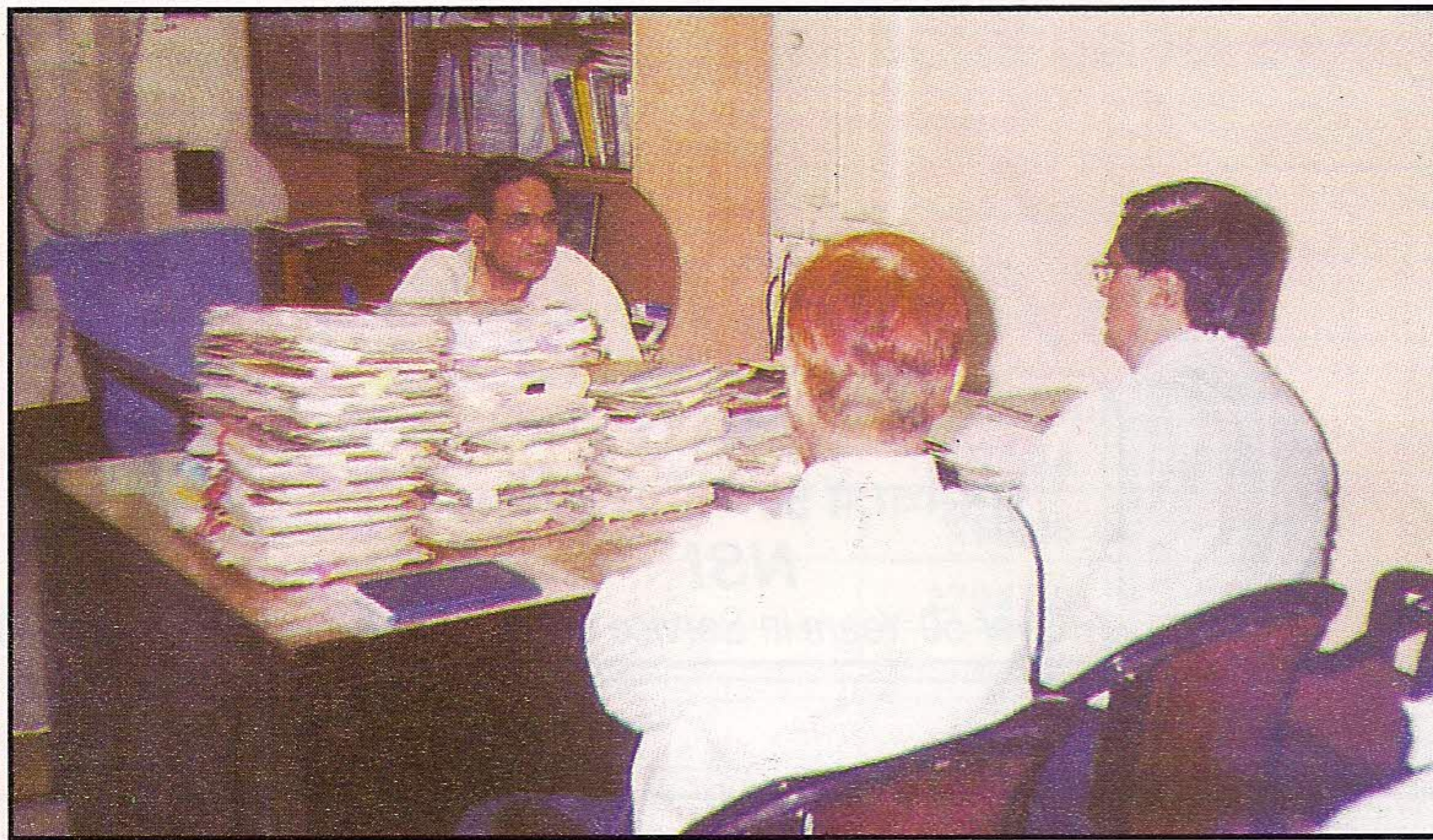
Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director, National Savings Institute, Ministry of Finance and Shri Ritvik Pandey, Deputy Secretary, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India, attended the 18th Board of Directors meeting and 18th General Assembly of World Saving Banks Assembly, held at Bali, Indonesia, recently. 34 countries participated in the said event viz Brazil, Chile, EL Salvador, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Iran, Italy, Kenya, Malaysia, Morocco, Netherlands, Spain, Tanzania, Thailand and WSBI HQs. Brussels. Mr. Jose Antonia Olaverrieta, President, WSBI welcomed the delegates for the General Assembly and number of issues were discussed during the General Assembly i.e. (1) Basel III regulations (2) towards opening of account for everyone and (3) lesson learnt from Doubling of Savings Accounts launched by Bill & Melinda Gates foundation, Shri Bhattacharya read out the country report on current situation of national financial Market with special reference to NSI, India.

Shri Bhattacharya also attended the Board of Directors Meeting, on behalf of Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India and during the event, he mentioned that Member countries of WSBI can take the advantage of the expertise developed by NSI in the field of mobilization of resources. Mr. Chris DE Noose, Managing Director of WSBI proposed to have a Cross Regional Conference in India somewhere in November 2011, where delegates from Asian, European, African and South American Countries will participate.

### **Director, NSI reviews Small Savings Collections in West Bengal**

Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director, NSI, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India, was on state visit during June, 2011. During his visit he met Shri C. M. Bachhawat, I.A.S., Principle Secretary, Finance, Govt. of West Bengal and reviewed the progress of small savings in the state He also discussed the strategies to be adopted for mobilization of savings in the State to achieve the target for the year 2010-11.

Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director & HOD, NSI emphasized the need to reach the rural areas and broaden the investor base so that the market share of the small savings could be increased. He requested the State Govt. to appoint more new agents in far-flung and rural areas as it will provide job opportunity to the unemployed people by taking up small savings agency. He further mentioned that NSI has been organizing Training Programmes in the State for the Small Savings Agents and the Officials of the distribution channels *i.e.* Department of Posts and Banks to enable them to mobilize maximum savings and provide better customer services to the clients of NSI. Shri Jameel Asgar, Regional Director (Sr.), NSI Kolkata Center was also present.

### NSI Organizes workshop on “ Strategy for mobilization of resources through effective co-ordination ”

National Savings Institute, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India, organized a workshop on “ strategy for mobilization of resources through effective co-ordination ” for Regional Directors from all over the country. The objective of the workshop was to formulate the strategy as to how effective co-ordination mechanism can be utilized for achieving collection target of Rs. 2,48,000 crore (gross) fixed by the Ministry of Finance. The workshop was inaugurated by Shri T. R. Thomas, Chief Controllor of Explosives. Shri Thomas mentioned that the investors should be briefed about the salient features of the small savings schemes at the time of investment to satisfy the customer needs. He also mentioned that officers of NSI should have humanitarian attitdde towards investors and should extend helping hand, especially at the grass root level. NSI should also co-ordinate with all such agencies to facilitate hassle-free maturity payment.

Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Head of NSI, mentioned that effective co-ordination is very important and key factor in NSI because at any level if the co-ordination is not proper, perhaps, there will be some distortion in communication. In NSI the co-ordination is done through team work between different agencies *i.e.* post offices and banks, State Governments, agency force *etc.* mobilize savings.
