NSI participates in WSBI Asia Pacific Regional Group Meeting at Bali, Indonesia

Shri Shaktikanta Das, IAS, Joint Secretary, Government of India, Ministry of Finance and Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director & Head, National Savings Institute were nominated by the Ministry of Finance, to attend 16th World Savings Banks Institute Asia Pacific Regional Group Meeting at Bali, Indonesia during 20-21 May, 2010. The theme of the meeting was "Promising opportunities for savings and retail banking in the aftermath of the financial crisis".

The meeting was inaugurated by Mr. Budi Rochadi, Deputy Governor of Central Bank of Indonesia and attended by Mr. Iqbal Latanro, President Director of P.T. Bank Tabungan Negara & Mr. Chris DE Noose, Managing Director of WSBI. Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director & Head, NSI chaired a session of "financial inclusion in the aftermath of financial crisis - the best way forward". The basic objective of the session was to analyze the impact of the financial crisis on financial inclusion policy in developing countries. During the meeting he mentioned that Financial Literacy and Financial Inclusion Programmes are very important for NSI, as it is working in the same area for more than 60 years. He mentioned that the developing countries can visit NSI and take the advantage of the expertise developed by NSI in the field of financial inclusion and NSI is going to organize a National-level programme on financial literacy in collaboration with Reserve Bank of India at Nagpur. Around 100 delegates from member countries of WSBI, i.e. China, Korea, Phillipines, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, India, Malaysia etc. attended the event.
