NSI GIVES TRAINING TO AFRICAN DELEGATES

The National Savings Institute (NSI), a premier institution which is working for more than 60 years in the field of mobilization of domestic savings, has conducted five-days training programme on "Sharing of experiences of National Savings Institute in the field of mobilization of domestic savings" between November 8th and 12th. The event was held at Indian Institute of Foreign Trade, New Delhi.

Though NSI has got a long track record of around 30 years in imparting training at the National and International Level for the executives from the Banks/Post Offices and Agency Force, spread all over the country, this is for the first time that National Savings Institute has organized a training programme for Senior Executives viz. Chief Executive Officers, Advisors to the Government, General Managers, operational Heads from different Countries of African continent. The training programme was highly appreciated by the participants and they felt that the concept of 'savings' can be spread in their respective countries.

The training Programme was imparted mainly by Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director, Shri S. K. Tripathi, Joint Director, A. K. Chauhan, Padam Singh, B. Raju Babu, S. L. Kureel and Rajiv Sagar, Regional Directors. The other faculties were Amitabh Deb, Senior Technical Director, NIC, Pune, Suryakant Dhoke, Technical Director, NIC, Nagpur and S. C. Malik, Director, NSSO, Delhi. The training programme was attended by 28 delegates from various African Countries i.e. Zimbabwe, Madagascar, Botswana, Namibia, Ethiopia Nigeria, etc. In the past also National Savings Institute has trained Senior Executives from different countries like Vietnam, Mongolia, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Uganda, Korea etc., who are working in the field of mobilization of resources and they have taken the advantage of the expertise developed by NSI during the last 60 years.

Expressing their views on the training programme, all the participants said that they are looking forward to have more international co-operation in the field of mobilization of domestic savings, from National Savings Institute, Govt. of India.
