The basic objective of World Thrift Day celebration is to create awareness among the masses about the virtue of thrift and Savings.

The Savings products of the Ministry of Finance are structured in such a way that it caters the needs of different segments of the society and being Government of India product, it has highest safety and security which is the prime objective for any investor.
