### **NSI ORGANISES WORKSHOP For RD's During 6-7 December 2007**

National Savings Institute, organised a Workshop for the Regional Directors all over the country on 'Sensitization for opening of One Million Accounts 'in rural India.' The workshop was inaugurated by Chief Guest Ms. Meenakshi Seth, Principal Director of National Academy of Defence Production.
