### **Govt. of India Amends Post Office Monthly Income Scheme**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 15 of the Govt. Savings Banks Act 1983 (5 of 1873), the Central Govt. amended the Post Office monthly Income Account rules 1987 vide Ministry of Finance notification No. GSR-763 (E) dated 8th December 2007. These rules are now called as Post Office (Monthly Income Account) (2nd amendment) rules 2007 and they have come into force from the date of their publication in the official gazette.

Under the amendment, a bonus equal to 5% of the amount deposited shall be paid on the deposits made in new Post Office Monthly Income Accounts opened on or after 8th December 2007.

### **N.S.I. Launches Special Radio Campaign For The Customers In Rural & Hilly Areas**

NSI created special radio jingles to promote NSI products in the rural and far-flung areas of Uttaranchal, Jammu & Kashmir and North Eastern states.
