Director NSI Reviews Small Savings Performance In Goa State

Shri Anil Bhattarcharya, Director and Head of Department, Ministry of Finance, Government of India during the visit to Goa called on Shri J.P Singh, IAS Chief Secretary, Government of Goa and Shri Uddipt Ray, IAS, Finance Secretary, Government of Goa and discussed about the performance of small savings collections and the strategies to be adopted for mobilization of savings in the state. He appraised the Chief Secretary and the Finance Secretary that NSI has launched Rural Savings Campaigns in the selected villages in the state to promote savings in the rural areas to increase the market share of Small Savings Collection as the rural segment still remains untapped. He appealed to the State Government to extend all out support in mobilization of savings in the state and requested the state authorities to appoint more new agents in rural areas as it will provide job opportunity to the unemployed people if they take up small savings agencies. He further mentioned that the NSI has drawn an ambitious plan of opening of 1,50,000 accounts in rural area till end of the financial year 2007-08.

Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Director, NSI also met Shri R.P. Gupta, Director, Postal Services, Goa and discussed about the various problems faced by the investors and agents at the distribution channel i.e. Post Offices and need for better services by the Post Offices. Shri B.R. Raigar, Regional Director, NSI, Mumbai Centre and Shri S.L. Kureel, Regional Director (HQ) were also present in the meeting.

NSI Organizes Rural Savings Campaigns Throughout The Country

Government of India Extends Income Tax benefits to TD and SCSS

The Government of India has extended the tax benefits under section 80-C of IT Act to 5 yr. Time Deposit and Senior Citizen's Savings Scheme. As such, the deposits made in 5 yr. Time Deposit and Senior Citizen's Savings Scheme will be eligible for deduction from the taxable income u/s 80-C of IT Act besides the PPF and 6 yr. NSC (VIIIth issue).
