Government of India Amends Post Office Savings Account Rules, 1981

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 15 of the Government Savings Banks Act, 1873 (5 of 1873), the Central Government amended the Post Office Savings Account Rules 1981, vide Ministry of Finance (DEA) Notification No. GSR-481(E) dated 11th July, 2007. These rules are called as Post Office Savings Account (Amendment) Rules, 2007 and they have come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

Under amendment, "A pensioner either individually or jointly with his or her spouse in whose favour an authorisation for family pension exists in the pension payment order" may open a Post Office Savings Account (Pension Account). Similarly in the case of individual account, the pensioner and in case of joint account, either of the joint account holders may operate the account for making withdrawals.
