NSI conducts Workshop for Regional Directors at Nagpur

National Savings Institute, Nagpur (HQ) conducted 2 day Workshop for the Regional Directors on "Engineering & Re-engineering of Savings Products" during 11-12 may, 2007 at Nagpur. The objective of the Workshop was to discuss about the marketing strategies to be adopted for retention of the loyal customers in the NSI' fold and also to increase the cliental base.

The Workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Sadu Israel, IA&AS, Principal Director, Regional Training Institute, Indian Audit & Accounts Department, Nagpur. In his inaugural address he said that the existing network of private bank branches, nationalized banks and corporate banks with a base in rural and urban areas across the country may be used by the NSI for increasing cliental base.
