## India Attended WSBI Board Meeting At Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia

India has been elected as President of the World Savings Banks Institute Asia Pacific Regional Group. Shri Anil Bhattacharya, Joint National Savings Commissioner and Head of Deptt. was nominated by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Finance to attend WSBI Board Meeting at Kuala Lumpur. The Board Meeting was attended by 28 delegates from different countries i.e. France, Ivory Coast, Indonesia, Germany, Netherlands, Russia, Japan, United Kingdom, Italy, Thailand and Bank Simpanan Nasional, Malaysia. During the Board Meeting Mr. Negara, Deputy Governor of Central Bank of Malaysia, presented a paper on 'Fiscal Policy of Malaysia'. Various issues were discussed during the Board meeting regarding NSI, i.e. WSBI are willing to organize General Assembly in India during 2007-2008. India has been requested by WSBI to motivate Bangla Desh and Mauritius to be Member of WSBI. It was also discussed during the meeting that there is a possibility of organizing a Study tour of Indian delegation to the German Savings Bank, during 2005-06. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Berndt, President of WSBI and also attended by Mr. Chris DE Noose, Chairman, Managing Committee of WSBI. A vote of thanks was proposed by Mr. Tajuddin CEO, Bank Simpanan Nasional.

### Govt. of India Amends Public Provident Fund Scheme

The Ministry of Finance, (DEAs), Govt. of India, have amended the PPF Scheme in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (4) of Section 3 of PPF Act 1968 (23 of 1968) vide Notification No. GSR. 291 (E) dated 13.5.2005. The Scheme may be called as Public Provident Fund (Amendment) Scheme 2005 and has come into force from the date of its publication in the official Gazette. Under the amendment the Hindu Undivided Family (HUF) or an Association of Persons (AOP) will not be eligible to open the PPF Account. It may be stated that the HUF comprises of all persons lineally descending from the common ancestor including their wives and unmarried daughters. While an Association of Persons means an association in which two or more persons join for a common purpose or common action.

The PPF Account will now be opened by individuals (in the name of Self/Minor(s)). However the existing PPF accounts in the name of HUF/AOP will not be affected. This amendment has come into effect from 13.5.2005.
